## Executive summary

**Personnel:** Community outreach coordinator interviews were conducted during the quarter and an offer made. Nancy Patterson of the University of Maryland Health Sciences and Human Services Library (HS/HSL) accepted the position and began her tenure on October 26. Nancy served as Head of Resource Sharing at the University of Maryland HS/HSL since 2006 and previously was head librarian at the Walters Art Gallery where she did community outreach and instruction in cooperation with local public libraries and schools.

**Funding:** During August we reviewed express award applications. Six training awards, 11 express outreach awards, nine exhibit awards, two outreach projects, one technology awareness conference, two hospital library promotion, six planning and assessment, six digitization, three community day, four library technology improvement, two follow-up and two welcome awards were approved for funding.

The first community day project was held in the region this quarter. Sarasota Public Library held a community fair on Saturday, September 26, 2009. Exhibitors and speakers were included in the program. The library felt the program was successful and contacts made were invaluable and lead to an appointment on the community emergency committee.

**Advocacy:** Staff met with the Johns Hopkins University Welch Medical Library staff to answer questions about the NN/LM programs. Janice continues to serve on NC Health Info Steering Committee. Several site visits were made to members this quarter including: MaFlo's Health and Awareness Team, Georgetown, SC; Rural Community Outreach Awareness Project, Georgetown, SC; Diabetes CORE, Georgetown, SC; Palm Beach VA Medical Center medical library, FL; Nova Southeastern University Health Sciences Library, Fort Lauderdale, FL; and Laupus Library at East Carolina University.

**Outreach to Health professionals:** Site visits were made to the Poarch Creek Indians, Atmore, AL and Bayou Le Batre Rural Health Clinic in Bayou La Batre, AL to discuss NLM training opportunities. It is hoped that classes can be scheduled in 2010.

**West Virginia University Center on Aging - E-HELP – Elder Health Education in Libraries Project**  
No report was submitted at the time of this report.

**East Tennessee State University - Appalachian Underserved Healthcare Providers Evidence-based Information Training and Delivery Project**  
Final Report: This project allowed for the following accomplishments: 80 clinicians now have point of care

tools in rural Tennessee practices, the Quillen College of Medicine Library has strengthened or started service relationships with 8 Tennessee rural hospitals, online ordering of articles via Loansome Doc has increased, MedlinePlus training to public libraries has increased, and awareness of PubMed/Loansome Doc to rural hospital nursing staffs has increased.

**University of North Carolina – Automatic Metadata Maintenance for NC Health Info and the Go Local Initiative**

No report was submitted at the time of this report.

**University of Virginia – NN/LM National Emergency Preparedness Plan Coordination**

Summary of Activity: Continued development of the online toolkit; monitored and added resources on H1N1. Classes and representations were provided at the Alabama emergency planning conference, Midcontinental Chapter/MLA meeting in Colorado and South Central Chapter/MLA meeting in Oklahoma. Designed a Preparedness and Response Plan specifically for use by libraries. Began exploring community and faith organizations as potential partners. Evaluating proposals for a toolkit usability study.

**MUSC - Hands on Health-SC Hispanic Outreach**

Summary of Activity: The goal of this project is to provide health information and resources in plain, understandable language to the Hispanic/Latino community with the objective of improving the health of all South Carolinians and to decrease health disparities. They have met the objectives toward that goal by translating original content from the MUSC Library's Website, <http://www.HandsOnHealth-SC.org>, providing Go Local access in Spanish and then reaching the Hispanic/Latino community with this information through a series of workshops and conferences.

The Website now has 16 health articles in Spanish posted. All articles include additional links to high quality, reliable related health Website in Spanish. The posted articles are: Breathing Disorders (Asthma, Chronic Bronchitis, and Emphysema), Influenza, Cardiovascular Diseases (High Blood Pressure, Heart Disease, and Stroke/Brain Attack), Cancer, Dental and Oral Disease, HIV, Metabolic Syndrome, Obesity, Diabetes, Health Disparities, Suicide, and Family Violence.

In addition, the online directory of services, Go Local-SC, has also been translated into Spanish. Six workshops have been conducted, demonstrating the use of these resources to members of the general Hispanic population and it has been exhibited at several conferences to professionals who are in contact with this population.

**University of Miami – Librarians and DOCS**

Summary of activities: A project proposal for the continuation and expansion of the project was received and reviewed. There were delays in funding due to email issues but work continues on setting up exhibits for the fall and winter months.

**University of South Carolina – Linking South Carolina Free Clinics to Quality Health information**

Summary of activities: Ordered the kiosks for the Greenville Free Medical Clinic, installed the kiosk at St. Luke Free Medical Clinic and requested a project extension through the end of February to enable receipt and installation of the Greenville equipment.

**Flagler Hospital: Promoting Community Care through Access to Electronic Health Information**

Summary of Activity: Flagler Hospital has continued to monitor and maintain the funded computer kiosk. The Community Outreach Coordinator at Flagler Hospital has been overseeing the use of the computer kiosks. Because of the H1N1 flu outbreak, there was increased demand for information packets.

**George Washington University: HIPS 4**

Summary of Activity: The highlights of Quarter 4 were: Curriculum development and workshops sponsored by 12 of the 16 organizations receiving HIPS mini-grants; a workshop for the five organizations awarded stimulus funding; and new student ISCOPEs team, which will teach health literacy at the Academy of Hope.

**Johns Hopkins University- Current state of access for public health professionals**

Final report: Surveyed and interviewed key informants from many sources to research the access routes to licensed information resources available to public health practitioners for each of the 50 states. The data collected will inform a future study of valid and appropriate access models that could be tested to address gaps where they exist. Findings are presented by state in a web-based format.

#### **University of Alabama Birmingham-Health Action Partnership**

Final Report: This project allowed the partners to further the broad community health goals of the Jefferson County Department of Health's Health Action Partnership (HAP) multi-level community health initiative, particularly those of the Access to Services Committee, of which the UAB Lister Hill Library is a partner. Primary objectives listed in the initial proposal were met, including increasing awareness of libraries and library resources as sources of health information and referral services within the public health community and the community at large, increasing the value of libraries and librarians as partners in community health initiatives, increasing the value of the library as a partner in the education of public health students, and increasing awareness of available resources for lower income residents needing access to services and information about health.

#### **East Tennessee State University – Color my World Healthy**

Summary of Activity: Official classes and tours of the library began during this period, and were well received by the community. Classes included: Blood Pressure Screening, Senior Healthcare Planning, Teens Healthy Lung, Kid's Health and Nutrition.

#### **Eastern Shore AHEC – Teen Health Initiative**

Summary of Activity: This project allowed a total of 56 presentations, during which 722 students and 9 teachers were introduced to MedlinePlus as the premier site for health information, and to <http://www.bls.gov/oco> (Occupational Outlook Handbook) as the premier web site for health career information. Follow-up visits were done with 272 students. The public library databases were also a very important part of the resources shared with the schools. Pre and post tests and teachers' evaluations confirm that nearly 100% of the teachers and students were unaware of these web sites and resources beforehand. The teachers are able to utilize the web sites in their daily instruction, and students used their own PowerPoint presentations to do peer teaching.

#### **Delta State University – Clarksdale Diabetes & Metabolism Center**

Summary of activities: During the time period of August 1 – October 31, 2009, the CHEC Education Center documented the following numbers of patients educated regarding care of their condition. The intent of the documented education is to prevent readmission for that same diagnosis. The diagnoses tracked were: sickle cell, congestive heart failure (CHF), and congestive obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD). The total number of education sessions for each diagnosis:

#### **Rural Medical Services – Popular Theater: Education Farm workers through entertainment**

Summary of activities: The theatre group performed at every possible farmworker clinic during the summer months, members distributed health information and talked with farmworkers. During this quarter, several group members attended the East Coast Migrant Stream Forum in Atlanta, GA where Rural Medical Services was awarded the Golden Lantern Award, in part, due to the innovative and effective theatre outreach.

With H1N1 being an issue on everyone's mind. The group created a presentation that promotes good hygiene and prevention. This was presented to a group of farmworker parents at a Head Start parent meeting. They will continue to use the presentation in the community to encourage prevention and to promote the vaccine.

An indicator of interest by the local community in this project is that other local Hispanic churches have expressed interest in forming a similar group and have asked for assistance. In addition, the project has

opened the avenue for greater participation and cooperation between local community groups and churches with our clinic and outreach.

**Mountain AHEC - Healthy Kids in Western North Carolina**

Summary of Activity: Librarians from the MAHEC Health Sciences Library are collaborating with a group of regional partners committed to reduce and prevent childhood obesity in Western North Carolina. That group of regional partners, originally called the “WNC Regional Obesity Initiative” changed its name to “WNC Healthy Kids.” During the first quarter the librarian hired for the project, Jennifer Stuart, devised a creative, effective means of incorporating, organizing and sharing data about regional activities on the WNC Healthy Kids website. The project team met with a number of individuals and groups involved in efforts to discern their needs and how information can help them in their work. Jennifer surveyed public health and related personnel. Through meetings and data gathering Jennifer has populated the online spreadsheet with considerable data, and has created a printed form for collecting further information from regional partners. **University of Maryland – College of Information Studies – Collaborative Computer Training to Improve Older Adult’s e-health literacy: a pilot study**

No report was submitted at the time of this report.

**University of South Alabama- Empowering Health Ministry Leaders**

Summary of Activity: The Sub-recipient Agreement was reviewed and needed changes noted. The final Agreement was forwarded to University Grants and Contracts for processing.

Working with one of the Health Ministry Leaders and representatives from the Center for Health Communities, possible participating churches were identified. Letters were sent to church pastors with phone and fax follow-up to those not responding. Pastors that wanted to participate were asked to complete a form naming the Health Ministry Leader and giving number of members in the congregation.

A problem identified in this project and by another individual from the Center for Healthy Communities who is also working with area churches on a project, is making contact with the church pastors. They sometimes are bi-vocational and are often involved in other projects and ministries. The timeline has been adjusted to accommodate these conditions.

Computers and flash drives were obtained. Computers have been loaded with needed software. Printers have been obtained. The PI, vendor and the collaborator from the College of Nursing met to determine needed health check tools. The order has been placed for these tools. URLs for web sites that would be of possible interest to the Health Ministry Leaders are being collected.

The collaborator from the Center for Healthy Communities is working to identify students to help with needed computer training for the Health Ministry Leaders. Eight churches have confirmed that they would like to participate in the project. Two others have indicated an interest, but have not yet returned their paperwork. Other churches are being recruited. A pre-questionnaire was sent to the identified Health Ministry Leaders. The first meeting will be held once the ten participating churches have been identified.
